The Taipei International Conference on Population Change, Labor Market Transition and Economic Development in Asia

CALL FOR PAPERS

Organized by the Institute of Economics of Academia Sinica and the Council of Labor Affairs of Executive Yuan, Taipei, Taiwan. To be held in Taipei, 6-8 December 2002.

The decline in fertility, the diminished rates of population growth and the increase in life expectancy have led to significant age structural transitions around Asia. These demographic transitions, in turn, have fundamental consequences for Asia's labor market transition and rapid economic development. At the macro-level, the age structural transitions are associated with the improvement in economic structure, the increases in saving and investment, the rapid growth of labor force, and the promotion of international trade while at the micro-level, age structural transitions are altering family and kin networks and households' allocations of time and money to children and older parents, in the form of greater spending on formal education and retirement pension. Among the issues, one of the most important features is that although the impact of population change on economy depends to a great extent on the social, economic, and policy environment, the subsequent demographic changes create opportunities for the implementation of a variety of economic and development policies.

This conference will focus on innovative work on the role of population change in Asia's labor market transition and economic development, including work at the macro- and micro-level. Two broad sets of issues are to be highlighted. First, did rapid demographic change contribute to Asian labor market transition and economic development? Specifically, what aspects of the development were influenced by demographic trends----economic growth, income equalization, industrial structural shift, labor market functioning, human resource development, productivity, innovation, labor turnover and migration, the low rates of unemployment and underemployment, the economic status of women and elderly, the relative weights of children, working-age adults, and elderly? What were the mechanisms through which population change influenced the Asian economies? What institutional, political, social, and economic features conditioned the influence of population change on development? Second, what were the roles of population and labor policies in Asian development? Specifically, what policies and programs were implemented----family planning program, labor law, education policy,

social welfare program? What is evidence there that Asia's population and labor policies achieved their goals?

Essentially, this conference will not confine its attention to any geographical area, but will instead bring together leading scholars working on the fields of population, labor economics and economic development. About 15 papers will be presented during the 2 days of meeting. Some of the speakers will be invited while the others will be selected from the call of papers.

We are looking for papers that present innovative work based on macro- or micro-level data, with a preference given for work using new or recent datasets, new methods of analysis, or new modeling techniques.
